Communal Baptisms are held every month on the first Sunday at 1:30pm and on the third Saturday at 11:00am (except for Holiday weekends). Register a month or two in advance for Baptismal Program.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION (Confessions)

Saturday 1:00pm-2:00pm & Monday 7:00pm-7:30pm (Sept-May)
Other times by pre-arranged appt. with a priest. Communal Penance celebrations (with individual confessions) are celebrated in Advent and Lent and will be announced.

RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

TODAY'S READINGS

1. **Jonah 3:1-5, 10**

At times, the words of the prophets were not only directed at the Israelites, but at foreign nations as well. Such is the case in the excerpted passage that makes up the first reading. Jonah is sent to preach repentance or destruction to this capital of the Assyrian empire. The word of God he speaks is so powerful that after only one day of preaching the city accepts the message, repents publicly with sackcloth and fasting. The experience stands in marked contrast to the Israelites themselves who so often fail to heed the warnings of the prophets.

2. **1 Corinthians 7:29-31**

Repent and believe was a common call in Paul's early letters, especially urgent because both he and these early communities believed that Jesus' second coming was an imminent reality. That being so, believers should live so as to prepare themselves by anticipating the life of the world to come, concentrating on lasting realities rather than on those that will pass away.

3. **Mark 1:14-20**

Jesus' first message is short, if not sweet. This is the time of fulfillment, the kingdom is at hand, repent and believe. The kingdom implies a radical presence of God, in the person of Jesus. Radical change is required to fully realize the power of "kingdom living." That radical change is both exemplified and symbolized in the response of the first disciples. They literally drop everything, abandon father and boat and follow Jesus. There is something about this person, Jesus, that will not be ignored or denied.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Like Jonah, have you ever given a half-hearted response to your faith?
2. Is there anything radical about the way you follow Jesus, or do you just fit it in with everything else?
3. Do you feel your life now is building up God's Kingdom?
