This journey can be covered rapidly or slowly, but certain essential elements will always have to be present: proclamation of the Word, acceptance of the Gospel entailing conversion, profession of faith, Baptism itself, the outpouring of the Holy Spirit and sharing in the Eucharist communion.

Catechism of the Catholic Church, n. 1229

This journey is called Christian initiation and it is one to which all of us are called. It is a journey toward a person— Jesus Christ; risen from the dead. It is He who wants to give us the gift of faith— the guarantee that we are sons and daughters of the living God who conquers fear and death in all the ways it manifests itself in our lives.

To help us begin or continue this journey the Church in recent decades has restored and revised the catechumenate and its stages (rites). It is simply this journey of which we speak that is open to all those who desire to meet Christ in His Church.
