RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS

Those who wish to enter the Catholic faith and Catholics who wish to complete the sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation are most welcome to begin the journey at any time. Call the Rectory.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners regularly practicing the Faith at our Parish are welcomed to contact the Rectory one year in advance of a proposed wedding date. Specific dates are only discussed after meeting with a Priest. Couples must attend a pre-Cana program and provide required Sacramental and other documentation.

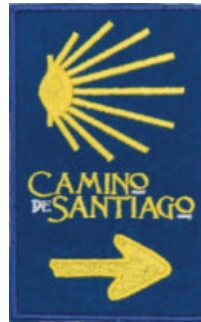

The Way of Saint James

This Summer, in celebration of my 50th year in this world (which will be October 30th of 2024), I am currently on a six-week mini-sabbatical (of sorts) to walk the ancient pilgrimage route of the Camino de Santiago, the Way of St. James. I am currently a little over halfway through the 500 mile walk across the north of Spain. To give you an idea of the distance, it is

almost the equivalent of walking from Washington, DC to Boston.

To help me commemorate and reflect on the life I have been blessed to live and where God may be leading me in the years that remain, I've invited family and friends to join me for different parts of the walk. There is one section I'm primarily walking alone—the Meseta—or the Spanish desert. It is a large flat plain where there is little change in the environment. As I conclude this section of my journey I thought it would be the perfect time to reflect on what God has said to me during the Camino so far and offer the reflection to you as a part of my Christian family at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.

In *Sapiens: A brief history of humankind*, Yuval Noah Harari takes the reader through humanity's evolution. I found it intriguing to learn that before the agricultural revolution, when humans were still hunters and gatherers, their minds were only capable of focusing on the present moment. This was due to them never needing to plan ahead and always being on the move. They did not have a home and did not know where their next meal would come from. They lived in the moment.

As humans discovered the capacity to grow stable food sources, our species evolved and learned to plan and anticipate cycles of time. Our ancestors needed to know the length of seasons for growing and harvesting. How much water was too much or not enough for their crops? How long would it take a domesticated animal to produce offspring? However with this development came the consequence of not living as often in the present. Humans began to either think more about the future or the past. Interestingly, when humans were living in the moment as hunter/gatherers they also were able to live with less fear and anxiety. If you only live in the now you are only attentive to the current moment. Fear and anxiety increased in the human experience. Incidentally, in a later chapter in the book titled "The Luxury Myth", the author outlines humanity's efforts to develop new technologies to create less work and more free time. The author details how, on the contrary, our technologies have not created less work but just created more efficient ways to do more with the same amount of time. We work far more than our hunter/gatherer ancestors.

I share this because this Camino pilgrimage, this journey, for me has been largely about trying to reclaim more of the present moment. For a brief time I hope to let go of my future schedules and commitments and perhaps let go of things I may be holding onto that are keeping me from being more present to those I love and whom I have commitments. Why may living in the present be so important to us as Christians? It's in the present where we

experience Christ.

Those of you who have studied scripture know that more than any other phrase uttered by Jesus in the Bible are the words, "Do not be afraid". Jesus was encouraging his followers to live in God's time, Kairos, or meaningful time, rather than Chronos—time which preoccupies us with future anxieties and past hurts and grudges. Those who had such difficulty with seeing Jesus for who he was could not get beyond what they were holding onto rather than be present to the one who was in front of them. Those who were fully present to Jesus' were able to see who he truly was. They gave Jesus their full attention.

The Camino has afforded me the opportunity to be free from my "fears" propelled by schedules and responsibilities so I can be more present to what God is saying to me. In the past three weeks I've been reminded that God is always speaking to me. I just need to be fully present in order to hear what God is saying. I have found that God speaks to me mainly in two ways: in silence and in my relationship with others. The Meseta has given me the opportunity to encounter God's voice in the many hours of walking with nothing but God's created earth all around me. And God has spoken to me in small ways in the encounters I have had with those whom I have met on this pilgrimage. Often God has spoken to me through a combination of an encounter on the Camino followed by silence. I've had conversations with God about my family, my vocation, my friendships, and much more. It's been a period of grace for me and a reminder to work into my life the capacity to be more fully present to the relationships in my life and create more time for silence so I can hear what God is trying to say to me. If you too are feeling the pull from the moment or the people you love in your life due to an overwhelming set of commitments or holding on to something from your past, perhaps you also can find small moments to be present and listen to what Christ may be saying to you?

If you are interested, I have been keeping a blog where I try to be honest and authentic in my reflections as I walk this pilgrimage. You are welcome to follow my journey. 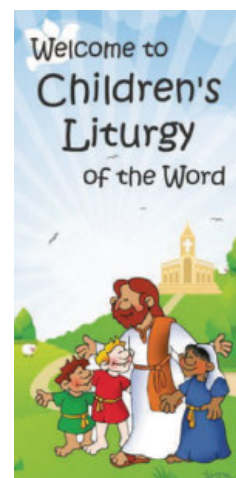

1. 2 Kings 4: 42-44

The early chapters of the 2nd Book of Kings trace the ministry of Elisha, the successor of the great prophet Elijah. Prior to the actions recorded in today's excerpt, Elisha purified a spring, supplied oil to a poverty-stricken widow, gave a son to a barren woman, raised that son when he died and purified a pot of poisoned stew. In all these, Elisha reminds his contemporaries that God was mindful of their needs. In feeding the 100 with a small amount of bread, the prophet, once again, assures them that God has the power to satisfy every hunger, with leftover to boot. Such will be the bounty to people of faith. But an apostate monarchy, devoid of faith, refusing to recognize God's sovereignty over Israel, continues to pursue its own agenda.

2. Ephesians 4: 1-6

Paul's dedication to his work as Christ's apostle has landed him in prison, a situation which gives authority to his present exhortation. Just as God's sufficient grace enables Paul to withstand this imprisonment for the sake of his ministry, so would that same grace enable the readers to live in a manner worthy of their calling. And what manner would that be? Paul is very explicit; through the power of the cross, they are to live as one family, a unity born of the cross, through mutual respect, humble patience and gentle love, showing to the world the face of Christ Himself.

3. John 6: 1-15

The feeding of the five thousand is the only miracle of Jesus that is recorded in all four Gospels. A crowd of people has followed Jesus to a mountain, reminiscent of Moses' experience on the Mountain of Sinai. What began with Moses is about to be fulfilled in Jesus. Jesus Himself is concerned about the crowd's hunger. Encountering the doubts of His disciples, Jesus Himself takes charge and sees to the feeding of the crowd. The story is filled with Eucharistic overtones, that it was near Passover, the thanksgiving and distributing, the gathering of the fragments. This miracle leads people to make a profession of faith, acknowledging Jesus as prophet and king.

REFLECTIONS FOR THE WEEK

1. Do you believe God feeds you?, Physically? Spiritually?
2. What hungers do you have besides physical hunger? Do you turn to God to help satisfy these?
3. "Gather the fragments left over," Jesus says. What are the excesses in your life? Do you share them? How could you do that better?
